Greetings Again Suffolk Members,

Well it is a bit late... but New Year's greetings are in order, so here's wishing you all a very happy & prosperous New Year from the Suffolk Breed Committee. Hopefully you all enjoyed the Xmas break, are feeling refreshed and are well on the way to getting the rest of your lambs away, your surplus rams sold & ewes sorted & ready for mating.

The talk prior to Xmas, was the wonderful achievement of Penni Loffhagen, Tawhai Stud, in winning the ultimate prize - SUPREME OVERALL ANIMAL OF SHOW at the Canterbury A & P Show with her ram Coleford 600/11, bred by JT Miles.

Now on everyone's lips, is the 'Big Dry' looming in many parts of the country. I only hope that breeders in the drought prone areas can get their stock to some fresher pastures, handy to home. Locally, the pastures still have a green tinge, & there appears to be plenty of feed to flush up the ewes ready for mating. We have had a minute amount of drizzly rain, and with the ground temp. being high, the facial eczema spore count will be rising. Already the Maramarua area is reporting 10,000 & rising, so have your Zinc medicals on hand if you use them.

Lamb prices – In the Auckland region before Xmas, both prime & store market values were reasonably good with small lambs making over \$100. Values have changed dramatically post Xmas. At the Tuakau Lamb Fair held in early January, lambs sold exceptionally well as there was an abundance of feed in the north. The tops as usual went to works buyers at \$104 & the sale averaged \$70.85. Now, at most saleyards, top prime lambs are making around the \$100-\$110, very nice 'eatable' lambs are making in the mid \$80's (great if you need to fill the freezer), but values have since plummeted for store lambs with many making \$30-\$50.

Down south.... Having just returned from a very crisp Canterbury, holidaying & visiting a few studs on the way, I had the pleasure in attending the Annual On-Farm Lamb Sale in the Rakaia Gorge, Canterbury last week. What a wonderful day out! There are 6 farms involved. 22,000+ lambs are sold on one day. The majority of lambs on offer are sired by Suffolk sires. Agents start selling at the bottom of the Valley & work their way via each farm up to the top of the Valley. Although the area is now getting very dry, the lambs were a credit to their vendors. The top pens from Peak Hill & Snowdon Station made \$119 & \$120 this year, very good for a 'drought' situation !!



Most livestock centres have already held their Ewe Fairs... Results at most have been reasonably good, but not attracting the huge high \$\$ of a year or two ago. Tuakau Ewe Fair, held early January had an offering of 12,000+ ewes. The top 2 tooth's made in the \$160's & 5yold's made \$120. Ram sales have been chugging along steadily, & most breeders (in the North) have almost or totally sold out now. Breeders I have spoken seem to be reasonably happy with the prices that they have gleaned from their private clients. Frankton Ram Fair, held last week, was reasonably buoyant; Most of the 'better end' Suffolk's from registered breeders made \$550-425 & the lesser end around the \$400 mark. Remember to keep your standards high, select & only keep your best ram lambs for breeding. If you do still have rams still available, don't hesitate to use the Ram database to help sell them. CHAIRMANS UPDATE

Fellow Suffolk Breeders,

2015 is now upon us and I'm sure will throw up its fair share of challenges and rewards as every year does. With most of the pre-weaning drafts having being done, it is rewarding to hear how pleased many farmers are that use Suffolk rams, with the high percentage they are able to kill off mum at good carcass weights. With good lambing percentages achieved by many this year the next question will be how will the lamb market hold up in the next few months? Typically farmer prices fall by 40c/kg on average between Dec and Apr before regaining some ground into May. Given the forecast for greater lamb supplies and average demand in key markets through the next few months the expectation is that the fall will be slightly larger than normal with the real pressure to be felt through Feb/ Mar as the lambs keep flowing, and export markets start reverting back to frozen demand. (Market Outlook)

Advertising - As a breed we have to keep positioning our product in front of the people who buy it – the committee recognises that this is an important part of breeding. Each area is responsible for its own advertising, with a national advertising campaign also representing Suffolk NZ.

Suffolk NZ has again been awarded a space for a ram in the Central Progeny Test (CPT). This basically compares the performance of all breeds, terminal and maternal. There are conditions regarding what rams can be entered, but if anyone is interested please let me know. For more information see later in newsletter.

Linkages – now is the time to begin thinking about mating options. Suffolk NZ offers an Across Flock Analysis for those members that are on SIL. To get more accuracy in how your flock is performing there must be sufficient linkages with other SIL recorded flocks, with a minimum of 15 offspring being sired by someone else's sire. (must also have been used in their flock that year) Suffolk NZ recommends those that are interested to consider linkage options for this year. Bruce Rapley has been running the Across Flock analysis so any questions please feel free to contact him or myself.

Suffolk NZ is again offering the Rams for Sale Database, which helps link unsold rams with prospective buyers later in the season. This is the third year we have been running this and is exclusive to Suffolk breeders only. Do consider this as an option if you feel it may help. Again see further details of Rams for Sale Database later in the newsletter.

Purchased in Jan 2013 by Tawhai Suffolk Stud, 'Johnny' as we like to call him, has bred very consistently for us, producing both Ram and Ewe progeny of top quality. Shown for the first time at the Canterbury A & P Show 2014, he won the Champion Suffolk Ram, Supreme Suffolk, Supreme Meat Breed sheep of show and **SUPREME OVERALL ANIMAL OF SHOW,** over many thousands of entrants. A fantastic achievement not only for Tawhai and Coleford Suffolk Studs but also for SUFFOLKS as a breed. RAMS FOR SALE DATABASE

This annual selling initiative that aims to link unsold Suffolk rams in the autumn with prospective purchasers by regularly letting key people in the industry know what rams are still available in their area.

Each of the four Suffolk areas has a database of key people where details of unsold rams will be sent to in the middle of February/March and April.

Breeders are to supply by email, fax or post their Name, Address, Stud Name, Contact number, Rams available & a brief description of Rams available (no more than 10 words). NZSBA will then send out this information with a covering letter to the key people in your area. You must nominate which area they would like targeted – Northern, Central, Mid Southern and Southern.

<u>RAM & EWE FAIR</u> -28th November, 2014

SALE SUMMARY:

1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th pertains to the Peoples Choice award.

Im my opinion, presentation was reasonably good, but with 58 rams entered the market was over supplied & as a consequence only 53% sold. Buyers appeared to be quite 'choosey'. There seemed to be not many commercial buyers present & bidding for the 'lesser types' was at times quite lethargic.

12 entries passed the \$2000 mark, with the top price going to G & DBeckett with lot 245, Phoebe 152/13 at \$5500.

There were 58 entries in total, of which 31 were sold during the Auction (53.44%) & the average being \$1652. Twenty three entries were passed in & 4 were scratched.

In the Ewe sale, 5 ewes were entered & sold at an average of \$260 for Penni Loffhagen's. Tawhai Stud.

Comments were made by some breeders that the \$2000 ram transfer fee set for this sale is too high for some smaller breeders.

SALE SUMMARY:

Im my opinion, presentation was good, & with 24 rams entered there was no over supply as there was in CHCH 2 weeks before. Buying power was strong & the sale seemed quite bouyant. The top price of \$8500 went to lot 124, Coleford 382/13, a meaty ram from JT Miles. 12 entries reached more than \$1500, with this figure being the Stud transfer price at this sale. There were 24 entries in total, 15 were sold during the Auction (62.5%) & the average being \$2900. 4 entries were passed in & 5 were scratched.

FLOCK RAM SALES:

Breeders in the upper North are having a reasonable year in regards to private Flock Ram Sales. At some, the 'tops' have made up to \$1650 & some breeders have averaged around \$700- \$820.p.hd. On the other hand, the numbers of Suffolk flock rams at saleyards are quite large, consequently some are struggling to glean adequate \$\$ values, making some breeders question whether or not it is worthwhile carrying them through for flock rams. John Key) are set to judge the ninth annual Beef + Lamb New Zealand Golden Lamb Awards. The Glammies aim to find the most tender and tasty lamb in New Zealand, with categories for both farmers and retailers.

Entries for the 2015 competition are now closed. The top 20 finalists will be determined at Carne Technologies, based on scientific assessment of yield, tenderness, succulence and colour of each entry lamb leg. These final 20 will be judged at the Grand Final held at the Wanaka A & P Show on 13 March, 2015.



<u>SNIPPETS</u> SUDAN VETS SEIZE EWES 'DISGUISED AS RAMS'

Officials in Sudan have seized more than 70 ewes with rams' sexual organs sewn onto them, after an investigation was launched concerning the country's livestock

export restrictions. Vets in Suakin port on the Red Sea coast were examining a flock of 1,000 before shipping them off for sale in Saudi Arabia when they noticed one sheep adopting the female posture for urination with hinds legs spread. Quarantine officers investigated further and found more than 70 of them were in fact ewes. The smugglers used fine thread to sew male organs onto the female sheep. The entire flock was impounded by customs officers, & a police investigation led them to the upland regions near Ethiopia & Eritrea. Al-Tahir Satti of Al-Sudani news says 'one reason why the smugglers went to such lengths to disguise the ewes is that productive female livestock are the most expensive in Gulf states, & Sudan limits the number that can be exported there. Rams, on the other hand, are less valued.' Abridged D.H

LEMON AND CORIANDER LAMB SKEWERS

- SONJA BERNYK, Super Food Ideas - Nov, 2012

These fresh and tangy skewers combine Asian and Moroccan flavours and are great for spicing up your barbecue. You'll need 8 metal or presoaked bamboo skewers 1/2 cup Lemon Juice



1/3 cup chopped fresh coriander leaves

1Tablespoon Moroccan Seasoning

700 g Diced Lamb

2 Red Onions, cut into 8 wedges (leave root intact)

- 1 Red Capsicum, cut into 3cm pieces
- Olive Oil Cooking Spray

Combine lemon juice, coriander and Moroccan seasoning in a glass or ceramic dish. Add lamb. Stir to coat. Cover. Refrigerate for 1 hour.

Preheat barbecue plate on medium-high heat. Thread lamb, onion, and capsicum onto skewers. Spray with oil. Cook, turning every 2 minutes and brushing with marinade, for 8 minutes for medium or until cooked to your liking. Serve.
